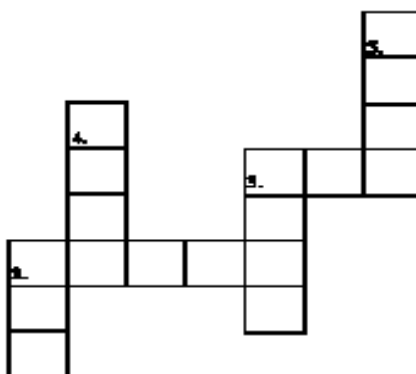
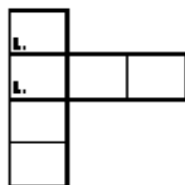

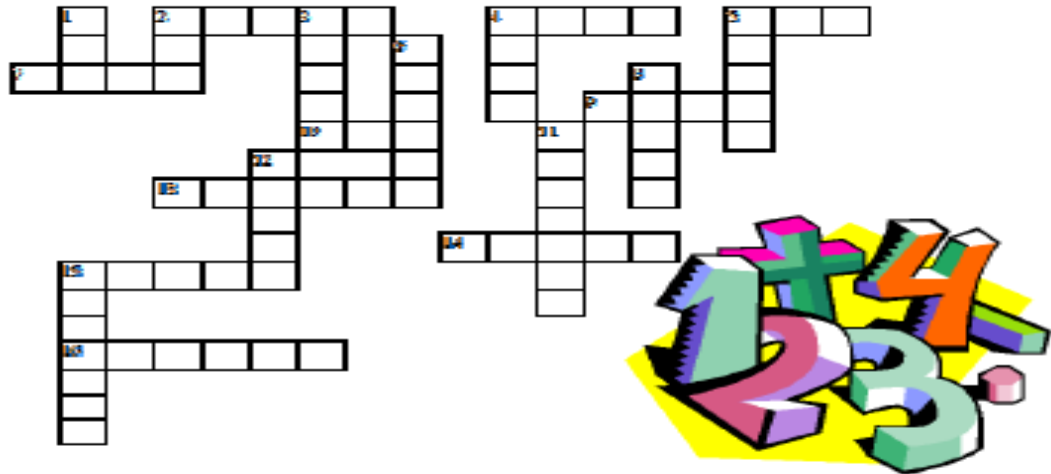

**NEVER KISS AN ALLIGATOR!**

Never kiss an alligator, hug an alligator, pat, poke, push, hit, kick, or even touch an alligator, because alligators bite!

Alligators are ancient and lived when the dinosaurs lived about two hundred million **0.** (200'.000.000) years ago.

The name alligator is from a Spanish word "el lagarto," which means "the lizard." Lizards do look like miniature alligators.
